News and Information

Breakfast and After School Club

For some time now the Governors here at RMJS have been looking at how we can develop our own before and after school provision at the Junior School. We have a long term aim of being able to offer this sort of Junior focused provision to all who want to make use of it.

The biggest problem we face in achieving this aim is finding a suitable place for the provision. It would be very impractical for us to use the school hall as this would put an end to the many different ways in which we use the hall at

the moment. We also have to have access to kitchen facilities which again would be very difficult from our hall. Due to these problems we have ruled out the use of the hall as anything other than a very short term solution if a permanent place can be found.

Therefore the only way we can offer this sort of provision is to purchase a separate building. We have identified possibilities and location – in the corner of the top playground where the quiet area used to be, but the problem is the funding.

There is no way we can afford

such a building from the school budget and the reserves we have built up do not cover the entire cost, as well as there being other priorities that we need to spend on. We have had discussions with the Equals Trust finance committee and there may be possibilities we can explore further to allow us to go ahead.

This is a key ambition for the Governing Body and we will continue to work on this project and will bring you updates as soon as we are in a position to, hopefully, move forward.

Holiday Patterns September 2019 Onwards

Nottinghamshire recently held a consultation about future holiday patterns, in particular changing to a 2 week October half term holiday. The final vote was in favour of this pattern and Nottinghamshire schools will be beginning this from Autumn 2019.

However, as an academy we are free to set out own holiday pattern and our Trust were keen that our school set the pattern that best suited our local circumstances. Therefore, after discussion, the Governing Body of RMJS has decided NOT to adopt the Nottinghamshire change and will remain with a single week in October.

This fits with the half term patterns of Toot Hill School and the Infants. Half term week will be week beginning 28th October 2019 and we will break up for the Summer on Friday 17th July 2020.

We cannot give you a dates sheet yet for the year because we are still organising the INSET days but the rest of the holiday dates for 19/20 are on the website on the school calendar.

Building Works

As you will no doubt have noticed, the school is currently getting a facelift. Equals Trust successfully gained funds from the DfE to follow up last year's new roof with a recladding of the whole building. The old brown tiles, which have been on the school since it was opened, are being removed then extra insulation is being added before the walls are reclad, in a rather nice shade of green! The contractors are working their way round the school and any disruption is being kept to a minimum. A lot of the bigger areas are being saved for the half term break.

We are also increasing security on the school site with a remote locking system being fitted, again, during the half term break. This will mean all visitors to the school will have to be buzzed in via a video entry phone system. Please bear with us as we get this up and running if there are any unforeseen issues.

Finally each class will be having a new interactive screen fitted during the break. Our old interactive whiteboards have lasted nearly 15 years now and we can no longer buy replacement parts to keep them running.

Thank you to all who baked cakes for this year's coffee morning. The morning was enjoyed by all who came and the children certainly enjoyed buying a cake for playtime! We raised a total of £278.25 for Macmillan Cancer Care.

Armistice Centenary

We are working with several local community groups to mark the Centenary of the Armistice. Bingham Town Council has worked with the constructors of the residential development off Chapel Lane to agree to name the streets after Bingham's WW1 fallen, and the children of Bingham have been invited to be part of this. Every child in the 3 primary schools in Bingham has painted a poppy design on the side of a brick, all

The bricks have been collected and will form an artistic installation of hundreds of poppies to form the backdrop for the unveiling of the first street name. This will take place on Wednesday 7th November, the ceremony starting at 10.45am. There will be music from the Toot Hill Big Band, laying of wreaths by children from each school and a song by 40 children from RMJS and Carnarvon. (Year 6 children learning the Young Voices
