Year 5 at the Space Centre

Year 5 had a wonderful, 'out of this world' experience at the National Space Centre in Leicestershire last Thursday. Having learnt lots about Earth in Space at school, children were able to explore the space centre and learn so much more. In the morning, we were treated to a show in the world's largest planetarium where we learnt about stars, constellations, planets in our galaxy, the history of astronomy and even whether life on other planets is possible.



After lunch we were able to investigate all the exhibitions including The Universe, Into Space, Space Oddities and of course the wonders of our Home Planet and how to look after it. A particular highlight was The Rocket Tower which has 4 floors of space exploration and as you travel up in the lift, you see up close a real space rocket. Children learnt about the Space Race, the first animal, man and woman in space and how astronauts survive in cramped conditions without gravity – including how they sleep, exercise, have fun and go to the toilet! The whole day finished with a competitive rocket building workshop where, after planning and building rockets in teams, they were launched and judged on flight paths and effective design. It was a pleasure to see all Robert Miles children behave beautifully in a very exciting, busy, hands-on environment. They really were a credit to the school. Well done children and we are relieved that no-one sneaked off to a real rocket destined for a long journey into outer space!



Sports Update



We entered a team into the County Dodgeball finals for the first time, travelling to Mansfield to take on 7 other teams in a round robin group format.
